GUIDELINES FOR CONDUCTING CATEGORY-B ADMISSIONS (MANAGEMENT SEATS) IN PRIVATE UNAIDED NON MINORITY/MINORITY ENGINEERING AND PHARMACY COLLEGES FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2013-14

A. NON MINORITY PRIVATE ENGINEERING COLLEGES:

The managements of Non Minority Private Engineering colleges are required to follow a specific procedure for filling up category-B seats in B.E/B.Tech courses as directed below by the Hon'ble High court of A.P on 08.08.2013 in W.P.No.21986/2013 and W.P.M.P.No.27470 & 27471/2013.

"Since, the process of counseling for category-A seats itself is likely to be consumed a minimum of one weeks time, the state shall endeavour to commence the counseling process latest by 10:30 AM on 19.08.2013 and it shall notify the same in three different newspapers each of English, Telugu and Urdu. The counseling process should also be undertaken online. Simultaneously, all the managements of the non minority private colleges of Engineering and Technology, shall taken out notifications in, at least, two leading newspapers, inviting applications both in the physical format as well as on-line for admission to category-B seats. The physical format of the proforma application shall be notified by each of the colleges on its notice board as well as one copy thereof to be sent to the university to which it is affiliated, as such as, Andhra University, Osmania University, Sri Venkateswara University, Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Hyderabad, Kakinada & Anantapur, etc. These universities must necessarily exhibit the proforma application form on their notice board and on their websites, so that, whosoever is interested in responding for admission against category-B seats can copy the application form and submit the filled in application to the respective colleges. Further, the A.P.State Council of Higher Education shall also be made available one set of the proforma application forms by each of the Non-Minority Private colleges of Engineering and Technology, so that it can also exhibit the proforma application form on its notice board. This would ensure that the prospective students, who are desirous of seeking education in the respective colleges of Engineering and Technology under category-B seats, will fill in the application form in time and forward the same together with the necessary enclosures thereto to the respective colleges by registered post and acknowledgement due. All such applications, which have been received by the Management submitted either in physical form or Online shall be considered and a merit-list shall be prepared in the descending order of the applicants and the merit-list must exhibited on the respective websites of the colleges as well as on their notice boards. The merit-list must also be made available for scrutiny of the Convener (Admissions), EAMCET-2013. To the extent of the capacity of the respective colleges of Engineering and Technology, the admissions against category-B must be carried out in descending order in merit amongst the applicants".

The managements of the colleges shall have to adhere to the procedure as stipulated by the Hon'ble High Court of A.P for filling up Category 'B' Seats.

In addition, the college managements are required to conduct Category 'B' admissions as specified in rule 6 (ii) (1) ((i) to (v)) and 6 (ii) (2) ((iii), (vi), (vii), (viii)) of G.O.Ms. No. 74 Higher Education (EC-2) Dept., dt: 28.07.2011 and as amended subsequently in G.O.Ms.Nos. 93, 47, & 60 Higher Education (EC-2) Dept, dt: 16.08.2011, 19.07.2012 & 28.08.2012 respectively.

In view of the above, the managements of colleges shall follow the operating guidelines as detailed below for filling up Category 'B' seats in B.E/B.Tech programs:

Admission Criteria:

- The Institutions that are approved by All India Council for Technical Education and permitted to fill NRI seats not exceeding 5% of the sanctioned intake in each course for the academic year shall admit NRI candidates (sons and daughters of NRIs) who have passed the qualifying examination with not less than 50% of marks in prescribed group subjects or 50% aggregate marks in the qualifying examination or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) equivalent to 5 on a scale of 10.
- The remaining seats shall be filled on merit basis with candidates including from other States and union territories who have secured rank at AIEEE (JEE-Main) and secured not less than 45% (40% in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) of marks in the prescribed group subjects in the qualifying examination.
- The seats remaining unfilled from the above shall be filled with eligible candidates on merit basis following eligibility criteria laid down in rule (4) of G.O.Ms.No.74.
- Thereafter, if any seats still remain unfilled such seats may be filled on merit basis with candidates securing not less than 45% (40% in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in the prescribed group subjects taken together/aggregate marks in the qualifying examination.

Admission Procedure:

- When the process of counseling for category-A seats is notified by the Convener Admissions, EAMCET - 2013 simultaneously all the managements shall issue notification for admission to category-B seats providing all the information in at least two leading newspapers inviting applications
- On the same date as mentioned in their notification for the issue of application forms the management of the college
 - Shall have to make available the proforma Application on its college notice board and also on its website.
 - Shall have to send the proforma Application by e-mail to the respective affiliating university.
 - Shall have to send the proforma Application by e-mail to APSICHE. (email: apschecatbeng@gmail.com)
- The concerned university and APSICHE shall immediately after receiving the proforma Application from the college shall display the same on their websites and also on their notice boards.

- The students who are desirous of seeking admission in the respective colleges of Engineering and Technology shall download the Application form, fill it and forward the same together with the necessary enclosures thereto to the respective colleges by Registered Post with acknowledgement due.
- The management of the college shall also provide the facility for the students to apply on-line.
- The data pertaining to applications received from the candidates day wise shall be made available on the website of the college for the convenience of the candidates in a transparent manner, which shall be scrutinized by any Officer authorized by the Competent Authority.
- All duly filled in applications received by the managements from the applicants either by post or online shall be considered and merit list of eligible applicants shall be prepared in the descending order of merit. The merit list so prepared shall be exhibited by the managements on its website and also on the notice board at least for 2 weeks.
- The merit list shall also be made available for scrutiny of the Convener (Admissions), EAMCET-2013
- The admissions against the seats available to the extent of prescribed percentage of intake shall be carried out in descending order in merit amongst the applicants.
- The college shall obtain ratification from the Competent Authority for all the admissions conducted under category-B seats by the institution.
- The management shall collect the tuition fees as prescribed by AFRC for category-B seats.

B. MINORITY PRIVATE UNAIDED ENGINEERING COLLEGES:

The managements of Minority Private Engineering Colleges are also required to follow the similar procedure and also the G.O.Ms.No. 75 as amended subsequently in G.O.Ms. No. 94, 48 & 61.

C. NON MINORITY AND MINORITY PRIVATE UNAIDED PHARMACY COLLEGES OFFERING B.PHARMACY AND PHARM-D COURSES:

The managements of Non-Minority and Minority Pharmacy colleges offering B.Pharmacy and Pharm-D courses are required to follow the procedure laid down in G.O.Ms.No. 74 & 75 and as amended subsequently in G.O.Ms.Nos. 93 & 94, 47 & 48 and 60 & 61 of Higher Education (EC-2) respectively.

- The Pharmacy Council of India vide Ref.No.: 14-2/2009-PCI-10834-12152, dt: 17/07/2009 has not approved 10+2 from N.O.S (National Open School) for admission into Pharmacy courses for the purpose of Registration as Pharmacist.

The managements of colleges shall comply with the above instructions and failure in implementing the same shall entail to withdrawal of Government permission, university affiliation and AICTE approval.
